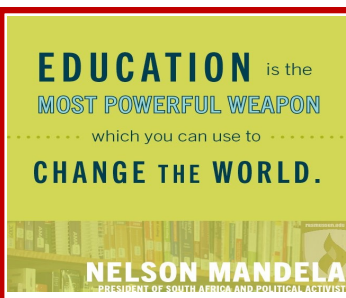
## Reports and parent meetings
