Homework

Students are asked to complete homework 3 times a week for, on average, the following amount of time:

- Years 1 & 2 = 20-30 minutes
- Years 3—6 = 30—40 minutes

Research has shown that while homework instills routine and discipline in children and helps them to practice and retain information they have been learning at school, completing **hours** of homework each night has little to no impact on children of primary school age. If you find that it is taking much longer than the required time or there is a battle every night over homework, please let the class teacher know so we can help improve the situation.
