On Wednesday, June 5th, World Environment Day, ISSR High School Campus took action through a school wide project to demonstrate our concerns about the attitudes of the local community to rubbish disposal. Students had been preparing for this day for several weeks and they had produced a range of visual displays and signs to be used on the day.

The day began with a series of House activities related to the theme and various representatives from relevant NGOs and a representative from the Sala Kamreuk Commune spoke to the students about their project and the impact it would make in the local community. And then it was off the back blocks of the commune. Our

whole school, students, support staff and teachers, gathered at a number of sites in Sala Kamreuk Commune to pick up refuse and waste and to spread the message to the local community.


After 3 hours of toil the students had collected a massive half a tonne of rubbish. The intention was not only, to pick the rubbish but to analyse what it is, where it came from, why it's there and determine what could be done with it. Students participated in workshops and focus groups to heighten their awareness of the multitude of strategies and options available and they produced a number of projects related to the event. This clean-up is something the school takes very seriously and our thanks go to Ms. Giulia and Ms. Li Wei for their excellent organization of the event.





World Environment Day

What a World of Waste!



On the morning of Wednesday, June the 5th, the ISSR High School divided into four houses to undertake a local litter pick up for nearly three hours.

Ms.Giulia Balducci, one of the organizers of the Environment Cleanup Event, told us that the event was mainly to raise awareness in the local area and the schools own students. People do not realize how much we contribute to the plastic pollution and how much it is increasing nowadays.

"I try to avoid plastic all the time". She said when we were interviewing her.

However, she mentioned how plastic has become really part of our culture. Everywhere you see people using plastic, polystyrene and other plastic. Tin fact, 40% of all the rubbish collected by the school was single-use plastic.

At the end of the day, Guilia Balducci announced that the trash would be collected by the local commune to be sold to be recycled.

Ms. Li Wei, the other organizer of the WED, told us that she organized this event because today (June 5, 2019) is World Environment Day. This event is a good lesson to teach us just how much of the earth is polluted by rubbish. When asked "How has your perspective on litter pollution changed?" She told us, "I was shocked that we collected so much plastic and polystyrene in such a short space of time. We have to think about this problem every day." Lastly I asked what she hoped to gain from this. She said "I hope locals and students will think about these problems and that the locals who saw us picking up rubbish start to picking up their rubbish and stop throwing their rubbish onto the road."

Irreversible?

One of the student's called Felix Wijnberg wanted to raise an awareness of littering and plastic pollution.

He told us that " its a good thing for the environment, but it's going to be a tough iob" He said that he was proud to be keeping the environment healthy for future generations; to be a role model for the community and making a contribution to the community. When I asked how he felt after picking up all the trash he saw lying on the streets. He responsed " It's a lot of work, and it also gains more respect from us for the people who clean the streets." It is getting him thinking 'how long is it going to be until all of this is going to be irreversible? He hasn't really changed his opinion on litter because he was already aware of this type of plastic pollution around the world. But he hopes that other people will change their attitude for the sake of our world.

Focus in Fauna

Also during field trip week the Year 7 and Year 8 visited Fauna in Focus, Siem Reap's first nature discovery centre. Through nature discovery, environmental education and workshops, Fauna in Focus aims to inspire a new generation of nature lovers and wildlife conservation leaders across Cambodia. This is done via guided visits to the centre, interactive learning stations, nature conservation movies, conversation-based activities and Q&A sessions with their knowledgeable staff. By the end of the visit students had gained a deeper understanding of wildlife conservation, biodiversity and environmental issues.



Year 9 Phnom Kulen Expedition

On the 12-13th June Year 9 students went hiking and camping at Phnom Kulen National Park which is located in Svay Leu District about 48 km Siem Reap and about 25 km from Prasat Banteay Srey. Phnom Kulen is the birthplace of the Khmer Empire, full of rich history and natural beauty.

The national park is located on a mountain, along the Kbal Spean River, which is tributary of Siem Reap River. The site is accessible by trekking uphill through a 1.5 km jungle track from the parking site. The river is shallow and many waterfalls have formed along the river.

The first day we trekked 4 km through the jungle to the big waterfall, this was hard work for some students, but the beautiful surroundings spurred everyone on. Along the way we discovered clouds of butterflies, termites decomposing fallen trees, many spiders and one scorpion. In the afternoon we swam in a cool, deep pool below Kbal Spean River's largest waterfall. It was the first time that many students had swum in a river, camped, climbed a mountain or had a bonfire.

At the campsite, Namyoung was quick to get a bonfire going, and he served everyone a pre-dinner barbecue. While the food was cooking, the rest of the Year 9s explored the woodland and river. The rope swing over the river proved popular and it wasn't long before daring leaps into the river began. The evening and second day were equally enjoyable, whether it was admiring giant trees and secret caves or the reclining Buddha, everyone had a great time and many new experiences.



Year 10 Field Trip

On Thursday 13th June the Year 10 students went on their end of year field trip. The students had choice between biking and archery in the morning and then all of the students met at Cambo Beach for a relaxing afternoon by the pool.

The archery group went to Royal Archery Club where they had a 90 minute training session in the basics of archery and they were able to spend some time refining their skills. All of the equipment was provided by the club so the students were able to have the use of professional grade equipment for the activity.

The biking group, who were led by an experienced guide (Mr. Samnang), undertook at 50 km bike ride on the circuit trail around the West Baray. The trail took them around the western boundary of the Angkor Archeological Park west of Angkor Thom. The route took the riders along sealed road and off road on single track forest paths. At the end of the trail the students rode their bikes to Cambo Beach for the afternoon activities.

Both groups enjoyed a refreshing dip in the pool and the more energetic ones sampled some of the facilities on offer. For most students, they were happy to eat some food and chill!
