


International Schools Volleyball Competition in Phnom Penh


A Maths hamper and trophy will be awarded to the school of the winning team. Y12 and Y13 students have formed two teams to take part in the competition.

Drama News



Key Stage 3: This term Key Stage 3 students have been reading and responding to playscripts. Year 7: Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde adapted from the classic Victorian horror story by Robert Louis Stevenson, Year 8: Stone Cold, adapted from Robert Swindell's young adult novel about a serial killer stalking young homeless people on the streets of 1980s London, and Year 9: Frankenstein, adapted by Philip Pullman from Mary Shelley's classic and revolutionary novel, which invented the genres of both Gothic horror and science-fiction.

All three texts are very rich in historical context and serious and mature themes concerning scientific responsibility, ethics, social justice and the place of the outsider and the marginalized in society. They are also full of rich, vivid characters, dramatic situations and scenarios, and opportunities for using design, sound effects and lighting. We have also looked at various different interpretations of the stories; Frankenstein has been turned into a ballet for example, Jekyll and Hyde into a Broadway musical, and Stone Cold into a BBC television adaptation to look at the many possibilities these stories offer for drama.



IGCSE

IGCSE Drama students have been studying *Antigone* and *The Crucible* by Arthur Miller. We have also looked at the work of various important theatre practitioners, such as Julie Taymor. Students have looked at different interpretations of the texts, such as productions of *Antigone* featuring Juliet Stevenson and Juliette Binoche, and comparing the movie version of *The Crucible* with Winona Ryder with *The Old Vic's* award-winning 2014 in-the-round production, directed by South African director Yael Farber. We have also looked at the social and political background of Miller's classic play, written during the McCarthy trials of the 1950s and set in Salem in 1692 during the Massachusetts Bay witch trials.
