

DIRECTOR'S SPEECH



Good morning, everyone.

Thank you once again for coming to our end-of-school-year activities.

Whilst the end of a school year is a happy time as we look forward to taking a break, it also comes with some sadness as it is always a time to say goodbye to some teachers, staff and students.

To those teachers leaving us this year, Phallin and I thank you for your service to our school and to your students. We wish you well as you move either back to your home or on to your next teaching adventure in some far-flung part of the world. The first person I was planning to thank this morning was Ms. Sue – our High School Principal. Unfortunately, a couple of weeks ago a family emergency occurred which meant she had to return to the USA as soon as possible. To her credit, she refused to leave until she was able to share her students' graduation celebrations, but she is now with her mother in her moment of need.

This year is also the last year at ISSR for Mr. Phillip our longest serving full-time teacher and present Year 3 teacher. Mr. Philip first joined us in 2014 and has taught in all 3 of our school campuses over the years. That's almost 9 years – a record that will be hard to beat. Mr. Philip – we thank you for your dedication to your students and your work on the management team and wish you the very best in whatever you have planned for the future.

We've made some changes to the ISSR's management structure next year. In an effort to have ISSR's Primary School and Secondary Schools work more closely together, we have decided to appoint a single, "whole-school" Principal. Mr. David Key, who many of you have known as Principal of the Primary School, will assume the position of Principal of both campuses. Mr. David has extensive experience, not only teaching Primary and Secondary, but also as Principal of both Primary and Secondary schools. Mr. David will be assisted and supported at the high school by our management team of senior teachers, and in the Primary School by Ms Sally-Anne who will assume the position of Primary School Deputy Principal.

For the past year we have been testing a new School Information System called "EDUPAGE". Mr. David has extensive experience with this system and has been working with teachers and staff to enter and test data so that parents and students will be able to access and follow their student's progress, access their timetable, receive messages, check grades, check homework etc, using a computer or the Edupage phone app. Edupage will be available for use from August this year.

A critically important part of ISSR is our ability to teach the Khmer Curriculum in parallel with the Cambridge curriculum. We would like to thank our Khmer Principal, Mr. Pheap, and Mr. Kimsoeurng, our Projects Manager, who work to improve and expand our Khmer school. Thank you also to our Khmer teachers, without whom the Khmer school would not have been the success it is today. When we think of school, we think teachers. But of course, a school is supported by scores of others, who work equally hard but are often unrecognised. We have a wonderful team of Accounts, Reception, Administration, Operations, Cleaners, Cooks, Maintenance, Drivers and Guards. To all of you, we thank you for your important services to our school and its students. Before I move on, there is one more person Phallin & I would like to thank -Mr. Ray – our High School Music teacher. By my calculation, Mr. Ray has been with us for 11 years. As is often the case there are a few people who do a great amount of work behind the scenes and often go unrecognised. Thank you, Mr. Ray, for all you do, especially in setting up the sound and music for these Assembly-hall functions. Whilst the end of each school year has traditionally been about reflecting on the past year, for Phallin and me, it has also always been a time for us to look forward. Since we first joined the school in 2011, we've built 3 campuses. Each time, we thought it would be our last building project. Each time we were also wrong about that. A few months ago we finalised our acquisition of the 5,000 square metre block of land next-door to the high School.



With the new high-school land, we will more than double the size of the High School campus and that will allow us to make major improvements to the School. We will build a new building that will house new Science labs, a staff & student canteen, an airconditioned assembly hall. new administration offices and underground parking for staff and students. We will also be able to increase the size of the pick-up/dropoff area. These changes will also allow us to make major changes to the existing building, including making an enclosed multi-purpose sports area and freeing up some spaces to create more classrooms. We will also more than double the size of the grassed sports field. At the High School, we also plan to build a boarding house, to house boarding students from neighbouring provinces who otherwise would be unable to gain an International School education. The boarding house will be on the school property but will have a separate entrance from the main school. And finally, Phallin and I would like to thank you - the parents who have entrusted ISSR with the education of your children. It is your continued support that allows us to continue to invest in the education of the next generation.

Thank you all, again, for coming – we hope you enjoy the program our students and teachers have prepared and practised for you.

Our new teachers are experienced in their own countries, have full teaching qualifications and international teaching experience. We have teachers coming from 5 different countries. We trust that these teachers will help us to set high standards in class work and a greater understanding of global differences.



Thank you to our great admin and operations team, who have contributed so much to our students learning journey. You are all part of a hardworking group that makes ISSR Special. We appreciate your care and encouragement of the students. The core areas of focus, which have been the catalyst to our success to date and into the future are:

1. The development of collaborative teaching and learning practices;

2. The increase in Assessment for learning;

3. Staff really knowing their learners and their needs;

4 Developing student ownership of learning;

Next year, we will see further development and improvement especially in

1.Curriculum Development with the addition of our new textbooks for English, Mathematics Science and Global Perspectives; Global Perspectives will be part of the curriculum for Year 1 through to year 6, culminating with a 1 term team project set by Cambridge Assessment and International Education, as a external assessment.

2.We intend to put in place new assessment and reporting systems: Y6 will be assessed in April using the Cambridge Checkpoint assessment, like that done in Y9 in the High School.

Class assessment and reports will be completed via EduPage our new online school management system.

All parents may download this app and have access to a range of pages including your child's homework, assessments through the term, and final each terms report. Communication with the teacher and notification of absences are also included on the app.

To ensure maximum parental usage of Edupage we will conduct workshops for parents and for the students on return to classes.

3. The School will be extended by 1 hour for fulltime English stream students. So that students will have clubs Monday to Thursday for all classes from 2.45 to 3.45. Pick up time 4:00pm.

4. In class, our aim is to have more focus on our learners with some students being extended and others work. doina catch qu This is something which I am excited and passionate about. Our team at ISSR primary will continue to strive to provide modern teaching and learning practise, to the highest standards.

5. We are introducing a new, online teacher professional development where our teachers can svstem. improve themselves by completing up to date courses on methodology and classroom management for example on a regular basis. Our learners are what makes our school special. They are excellent ambassadors in the community, whether trips. on community events or learning excursions. They can all be relied upon to represent the school with pride and dignity. As I reflect on what the children have achieved and how far they have all come. I want to congratulate all our wonderful Year 6 and Reception 2 students in achieving a great milestone in your life.
