### Safeguarding in Schools- Ensuring a Safe Learning Environment

#### **Examples of Harm in Schools**

- 2. Emotional Harm: Psychological abuse, including bullying, harassment, and emotional neglect

- 4. **Sexual Harm:** Any form of sexual abuse or exploitation

## What can we do to Safeguard in Schools?

- 5. Engage with the Community: Work with parents, carers, and external agencies to support the well-being of students. Build strong partnerships to enhance safeguarding efforts.

By understanding and implementing these safeguarding measures, the school can create a safe and supportive environment where our students can thrive. Remember, safeguarding is everyone's responsibility, and together, we can protect our students from harm.
